Our Values and our Enquiry

This half term our Value is Aspiration. Our Enquiry focus is What is Greatness? Every class will question and consider the meaning of Aspiration and Endeavour and use it as a driver for their learning. Class 4 will explore the vastness of Space and exploration of our Solar System from Galileo up to the present day. Class 3 will learn about the intrepid voyage from Newlyn to Australia made by seven brave Cornishmen in 1850s. Their learning will culminate in a trip to Falmouth Maritime Museum in December. Class 1 will step back into history and learn about the Great Fire of London in 1666, whilst Class 2 will learn about the exceptionally great talent, Sir Christopher Wren, who rebuilt and reenergised our capital city following the inferno.

At the end of last term, we held a collaborative Celebration of Learning of the children's outcomes across the school as the children learnt about Belonging and their own roots. It was a fabulous slice of the history and geography that have shaped our community which was enriched by everyone's time, commitment, and generosity to make the learning so very good. We now have another excellent addition to our outdoor area and a fantastic space to use, store and access our outdoor learning equipment safely and effectively.
