Premises Improvements

Over the summer, we have made considerable improvements in and around the school. It is always a formidable challenge given the beauty and age of our premises, but we are really pleased with the timely and considered changes.

Outside, new fencing has been replaced or put up around the playground and field. Significant areas outside have been reborn and reclaimed from the abundant growth of the last few years. We have also discovered some new and exquisite learning areas. The installation of our much-anticipated outdoor gym equipment has been delayed slightly but they will be set and ready for action in the front playground before the end of the term.

Inside the school, are classrooms have been reorganised and are looking pristine and ready to go. Our existing lighting system now has permanent fixings in the hall. The lights will complement our most significant and dramatic improvement which has been the complete renovation of the floor in the hall. The original boards have been sanded back, varnished, and polished are now resplendent. It has dramatically transformed the environment which in turn, will enhance so much of our day and curriculum.



Swimming

Next week we'll begin our swimming lessons. Sometimes daunting but always rewarding, we are really looking forward to all the children getting back into the pool to develop this essential life skill. Year 1 and Class 2 children will need their kit on Mondays. Classes 3 and 4 will need their kit every Wednesday.

Open Classrooms

We know how important everyone's connection, passion, and commitment to learning really matters for every single child. During the final week of this term, we would like to open up the classrooms to parents and carers so that the children can showcase and share their achievements. As well as helping parents and carers engage with the school, we know it will help them know and remember more about what they have learnt. Each day of the week, one of the classes will be opened from 3:30pm and the children will be able to revisit and guide you through their learning.

Pupil Leadership Tribe

Next week, we will be holding class elections to decide democratically which children will become a member of our School Council or Pupil Leadership Team. The children will need to complete an application to firstly express their interest before demonstrating to their classmates why they should be chosen. Being part of the Pupil Leadership Team is a vital cog to capture the voice of the child and help improve our school.
